## ARTICLE XI—AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

**Section A—** The propose amendment shall be submitted in writing to the President and must be accompanied by a petition containing the signatures of 5 members in good standing.

**Section B—**The amendment shall be read, as proposed, at the first general membership meeting following the submission.

**Section C—**The proposed amendment shall then be published in the next issue of the Membership newsletter.

**Section D—**At the first meeting after the publishing of the proposed amendment, it shall be read as proposed and voted upon.

**Section E—**The proposed amendment shall be adopted into the constitution only if it receives a two thirds majority of the votes of the total members present and voting.

## ARTICLE XII—DISSOLVEMENT

**ASSETS AT DISSOLUTION** Upon dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations exclusively for such purposes.
